A phrase or opinion that is overused and shows a lack of original thought








MODULAR

Dividing your spread into boxes using a grid method. Fiilling each box with content and secondary coverage.



It is the portion of a page left unmarked White space is good space Allows your design to "breathe"










MARGINS


Internal: white space between all of the elements on a spread




